DECEMBER 20 LODGE MEETING

The chapters gave their reports, and then copies of the 1990 membership reports were handed out. The unit elections flyer to be delivered to everyone was passed and looked at. The Vigil Honor recommendation forms would be sent in the Marmot's Whistle, and would be collected in March and April, and announced at
