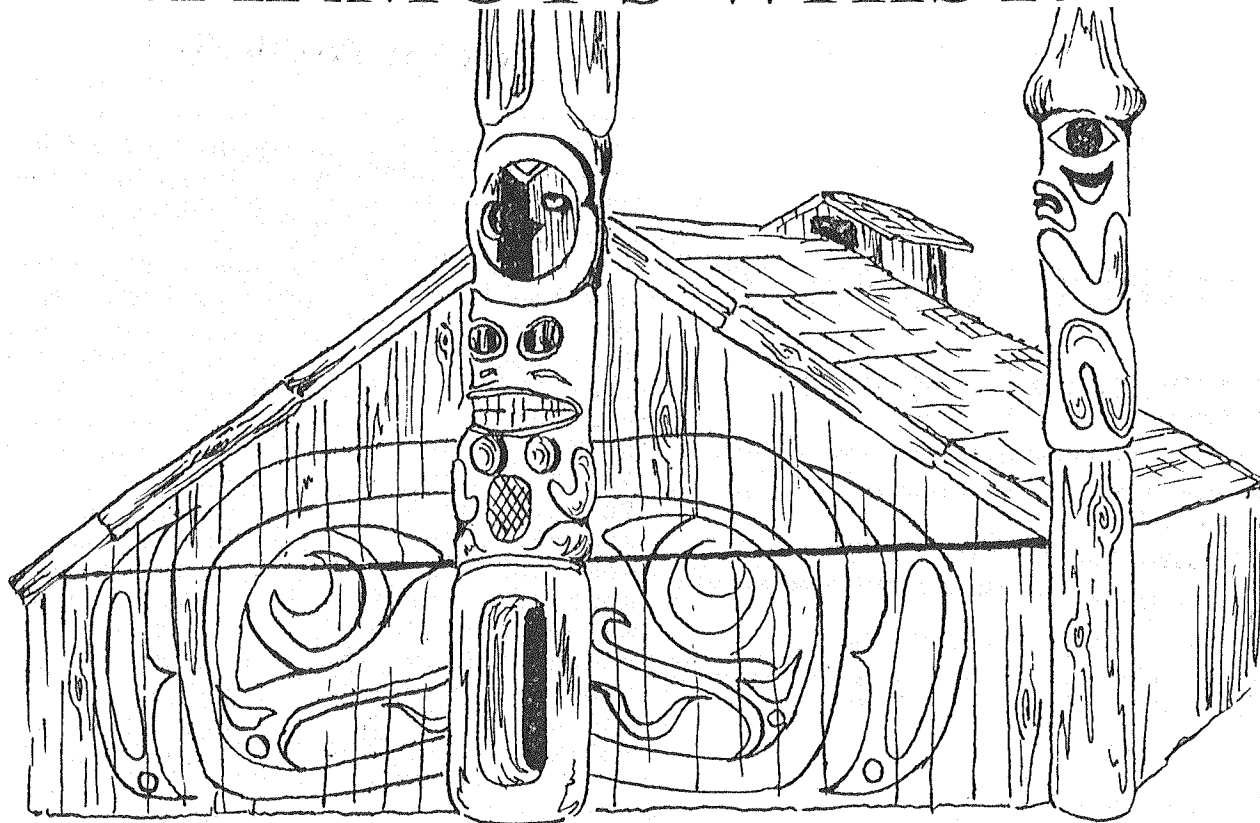


MARMOT'S WHISTLE
